MISSISSIPPI

Tishomingo State Park is gorgeous and inviting, the perfect place to spend a pleasant summer day or to enjoy a family camping trip. Hikers will find huge rock formations, outcroppings, and bluffs throughout the park. Mossy boulders and wildflowers are everywhere. The area's natural beauty has been appreciated for centuries: Traces of Native American culture run all through this park, from its namesake (Chief Tishomingo of the Chickasaw Nation) to archaeological sites revealing the lives of the Paleo-Indians who lived off the land thousands of years ago. Modern visitors can take canoe float trips down Bear Creek, angle for catfish and bass at Haynes Lake, rock climb, swim at the park's pool, and even play disc golf at three 18-hole courses. SL
